His craftsmanship was remarkable and his eye for detail and strive for perfection were unmatched. He did not say much, but the words he spoke were spot on and to the point.


His example has been crucial for me to be who I am. His dedication to his family has taught me about commitment. Last year, my mom and dad celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary; a crown on their journey of friendship, love, care and compassion. Koop would have turned 75-years-old in August this year.

Seeds in His Garden became his place of passion over the years. At first, my dad wasn't a fan of my "escapade" to Kenya but over the years he opened his heart to the children and became their "Opa". Kenya

became his "happy" place, especially after he became sick. The joke with the doctors was that his health insurance should cover his trips to Kenya as he often came back healthier from a trip to Seeds.

Koop has physically contributed to all the houses we lived at over the years and his last project unfortunately remains unfinished – the tiling in the Volunteer/Life Skills House. During his last visit to Kenya – Opa made a "Lego Table" for the little ones and he brought and assembled the bicycle for Luke that he custom build. They will be amongst the many things that will remind us of Opa on a daily basis.

Koop will never physically be at Seeds again but his spirit will be on the site and in our hearts forever.
